I am still wondering why I was invited, but if they got the wrong man, they re sorry now, for, I ate an awful lot! Guandma and Granddad, are now snoring peacefully behind me, and I must nt let them have all the sleep to themselves.

Americans are grand people, F.ora, I know them, but don't forget that you are a Scot, and, Highland at that!
